What If Georgia Voters Could Vote *Against* a Candidate for US Senate If They Really Did Not Like Someone Whose Name Was On The Ballot? In That Case, For What It Is Worth: Democrat Ossoff Would Lead Perdue 25% to 20%; Democrat Warnock Would Lead Loeffler 24% to 20%:

The concept of a "negative vote" in a prominent election, where citizens could decide to vote either "for" or "against" anyone on the ballot, has floated around for some time, and is tested today in Georgia, where voters will decide the fate of the United States Senate in 2 runoff elections 01/05/2021.

In brand-new Voter Roll Call research conducted exclusively for the Negative Vote Association and Negative.Vote, the pivotal 2 runoff contests, among registered GA voters, stand as follows:

- * Democrat Jon Ossoff, 25%.
- * Republican incumbent David Perdue, 20%.
- * Democrat Raphael Warnock, 24%.
- * Republican incumbent Kelly Loeffler, 20%.
- * 33% of GA registered voters vote "for" Ossoff, just 8% vote "against."
- * 36% of GA registered voters vote "for" Perdue, but 16% vote "against."
- * When 8% are subtracted from Ossoff's 33%, he is left with 25% net.
- * When 16% is subtracted from Perdue's 36%, he is left with 20% net.
- * Ossoff flips the seat, in this reckoning.
- * 34% of GA registered voters vote "for" Warnock, just 10% vote "against."
- * 35% of GA registered voters vote "for" Loeffler, but 15% vote "against."
- * When 10% are subtracted from Warnock's 34%, he is left with 24% net.
- * When 15% are subtracted from Loeffler's 35%, she is left with 20% net.
- * Warnock flips the seat, in this reckoning.
- * Charles Schumer, Democrat of NY, is the new US Senate Majority Leader, in this reckoning.
- * The reign of Mitch McConnell, Republican of KY, as US Senate Majority Leader, ends, in this reckoning.

When GA voters are not given the opportunity to vote against, and, as is the case at present, may either vote for a candidate or may sit home:

- * Ossoff leads among those who tell Voter Roll Call they have already returned a ballot.
- * Perdue leads among those who tell Voter Roll Call they are certain to vote in the runoff but have not yet done so.
- * Warnock leads among those who tell Voter Roll Call they have already returned a ballot.
- * Loeffler leads among those who tell Voter Roll Call they are certain to vote in the runoff but have not yet done so.

About : Voter Roll Call interviewed 650 state of GA adults 12/14/20 through 12/17/20. Of the adults, 565 are registered to vote in Georgia and were asked the for/against runoff questions. This research was conducted online. A representative cross-section of Georgia adults was weighted to the most recent US Census Bureau estimates for gender, age, race, education, home-ownership, and political party.

Statement of Methodology: Voter Roll Call opinion research is conducted using a methodology optimized for each particular project. In some cases, this means data is collected 100% by telephone; in some cases, 100% online; and in other cases, a blend of the two. For those projects that are conducted “mixed-mode” (or “multi-mode”): Respondents who have a home (landline) telephone are interviewed by phone, sometimes using live interviewers, other times using the recorded voice of a professional announcer. The youngest male is requested on approximately 30% of calls to home phones, the youngest adult is requested on approximately 70% of calls. This method of intra-household selection reduces the potential for age and gender imbalance in the unweighted sample. Re-attempts are made to busy signals, no-answers, and answering machines. Landline telephone sample is purchased from Aristotle of Washington DC. Respondents who do not use a home telephone are interviewed on an electronic device, which means, for some projects, that call-center employees hand-dial cell phones and interview respondents verbally on the respondent’s cell phone, and means, for other projects, that Voter Roll Call displays the questions visually on the respondent’s phone, tablet, or other device. Sample for respondents who do not use a home telephone is purchased from Aristotle or from one of several other research companies that provide access to cell respondents. Where meaningful, Voter Roll Call indicates the percentage of respondents who use a home phone and the percentage who do not, and crosstabs by this distinction. Responses are minimally weighted to U.S. Census or voter file targets for gender, age and race. Target (cell) weighting is used. On questionnaires that ask about political party identification, Voter Roll Call may or may not weight to Party ID, depending on client preference. Where necessary, questions and answer choices are rotated to prevent order bias, recency, and latency effects. On some studies, certain populations are over-sampled, so that the number of unweighted respondents exceeds the number of weighted respondents. Each individual Voter Roll Call release contains the date(s) on which interviews are conducted and a release date. If interviewing for a particular study is conducted in Spanish, or in any other foreign language, it will be noted on the specific release. If no notation appears, interviews are conducted in English. Where respondents are filtered, such as adults, filtered to registered voters, in turn filtered to likely voters, Voter Roll Call describes the filtering on the specific release. On pre-election polls in geographies with early voting, Voter Roll Call differentiates between respondents who have already voted and those who are likely to vote but have not yet done so. On research completed prior to 12/31/16, Voter Roll Call assigned to each question within the instrument a theoretical margin of sampling error. Effective 01/01/17, Voter Roll Call assigns to each question within the instrument a credibility interval, which better reflects the sampling uncertainties associated with gathering some percentage of respondent answers using non-probability sample. Though commonly cited in the presentation of research results, “sampling error” is only one of many types of error that may influence the outcome of an opinion research study. More practical concerns include the way in which questions are worded and ordered, the inability to contact some, the refusal of others to be interviewed, and the difficulty of translating each questionnaire into all possible languages and dialects. Non-sampling errors cannot be quantified. This statement conforms to the principals of disclosure as recommended by the National Council on Public Polls (NCPP).
